THE KENOSHA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DOES HEREBY ORDAIN that the Municipal Code of Kenosha County Chapter 4 (3) (f), is hereby amended as follows:

(3). Candidates for Deputy Sheriff.
(f.) Appointments.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Sheriff shall have the authority to appoint a former Kenosha County Deputy Sheriff who resigned in good standing and State of Wisconsin Certified Law Enforcement Officers seeking a lateral transfer in a separate and expedited selection process.

The following eligibility requirements must be met to participate in this expedited selection process:

- Former Kenosha County Sheriff's Department Deputy who resigned in good standing; or
- A State of Wisconsin Certified Law Enforcement Officer (from another WI law enforcement agency); or
- A certified law enforcement officer outside the State of Wisconsin and is granted reciprocity through the State of Wisconsin Law Enforcement Standards Board (LESB); and
- Has a good standing disposition with the Law Enforcement Standards Board (LESB).

This expedited selection process will include:

- a. Application (Civil Service Ordinance 4.01(3)(b)).

- b. Eligibility (Civil Service Ordinance 4.01(3) (c) 1-7).
- c. Background Investigation (Civil Service Ordinance 4.01(3) (d) 4).
- d. Oral Interview/Evaluation by Sheriff and Command Staff (Civil Service Ordinance 4.01(3) (d) 5).
- e. Job Trait Assessment (Civil Service Ordinance 4.01(3) (d) 7).
- f. Medical Examination (Civil Service Ordinance 4.01(3) (d) 8).

Deputy Sheriff Candidates who meet these criteria and pass all phases of this expedited selection process outlined herein will be placed on a separate priority eligibility list and given first consideration for open deputy positions.

67. Any candidate who has been decertified from an eligibility list and failed to progress in the recruitment process at any point may not sit again for the examination until one year has passed from the date of the previous examination.

78. The Sheriff, in appointing Deputies under this section, shall require a uniform bond of not less than \$25,000.00. The premium on the bond shall be paid by Kenosha County.

89. All Deputies under this section shall be on probation during the first full year next succeeding their appointment, and may be discharged with cause by the Sheriff at any time before the termination of such probationary period.

910. The established residency boundary for all unit members is twenty (20) miles in any direction from the borders of Kenosha County. Any unit member who does not reside within twenty (20) miles of the borders of Kenosha County within nine months of hire shall be deemed to have resigned.

1011. Deputy Sheriffs appointed in conformity with the provisions of this chapter shall hold office on good behavior and efficiency and shall not be dismissed from such office or suspended except as provided in this section.
