


Responsibilities in current position

Provide leadership and decision-support in all aspects, of administration, suppression, prevention and Emergency Medical Services operations for the Village. Collaborate internally with all Village department staff members as well as externally with local and regional public safety agencies. Work in partnership with private companies and organizations to progress initiatives for the benefit of the community. Responsible for a 5+ million-dollar financial budget to support public safety operations that include personnel, equipment, and facilities.
