AUGUST 7, 2007

The **Regular Meeting** was called to order by Chairman Rose at 7:30 p.m., in the County Board Room located in the Administration Building. Roll call was taken.

CITIZEN COMMENTS

Larry Zamba, 1720-216th Ave., Brighton. He feels overall, **Healthy Wisconsin** is an excellent plan. New employment in the state would greatly improve due to health benefits. He can see nothing but good coming from this.

Leah Blough, 8355-57th Ave., Kenosha. She has been a nurse for 18 years and the health insurance situations are getting worse. We pay huge sums of money for very little coverage. There are people using the emergency room in place of office visits. Health Care should be a right and not just for the privileged. Insurance Companies will be on an even playing field and not profit through loopholes.

Marge Krupp, 11427-79th Place, Pleasant Prairie. We need **Healthy Wisconsin** because it is a cost savings for everyone and she does not understand any opposition to it.

Dan Krupp, 11427-79th Place, Pleasant Prairie. He worked as a school psychologist for 31 years. He saw many hard working families who had children and could not afford to see a doctor. It was just deplorable.

CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chairman Rose stated that on September 18th at the regular County Board Meeting he will announce the appointments from the Youth & Governance Committee recommendations. This is the project sponsored by the Extension Education Committee. There will be a reception at 6:30 p.m. The youth members will be present.

Supervisor Singer, stated that everyone is invited to attend the Building & Grounds Committee Meeting next Tuesday. Some of the projects going on are: the parking lot between the Courthouse and Molinaro Building, the flooring at Brookside is coming along well and it looks really good. The Kemper Center roofing has been re-bid. Many more people have gone through the walk-thru. And the bids will be coming.

Supervisor Noble reported on Highway & Parks meeting last night. Highway "S" is still under construction and with weather permitting it should be done in about two weeks. The detour to the west of County "H" has been taken off. Highway "L" was closed for a week due to railroad crossing repair. The bike path at "E" is delayed because of Federal money being involved. The Frank

Fabiano, Jr. Memorial outing is this Saturday. The fund raiser for junior golf is on Wednesday, August 22nd.

Supervisor Rossow stated that Human Services met just before tonight's meeting and she just wanted to make the County Board aware of the resolutions that will be coming. The Workforce Development will be receiving from the State funds \$28,000 to up-grade computers & printers. A resolution prohibiting smoking in all Wisconsin work-sites including restaurants and taverns. Also, County Executive, Allan Kehl, sent a letter to the State Budget Conference Committee members urging them to restore the funding language to lower Kenosha County's Family Share Contribution to 22% of Community Aids. Supervisor Molinaro spoke about the 1st reading of a City Ordinance regarding placement of sexual predators. His concern is that this burden will be put on other outlying communities. A number of motels along Sheridan Road in Somers have contracts with the State. If anything is to be put into place, it should be county-wide.

Chairman Rose referred this issue to Human Services and Judiciary & Law Committees and a joint meeting should be next week.

Supervisor Elverman reported on the Administration Committee Meeting last night and discussion of the Non-Represented Pay Plan. We are able to compete with the private sector. The problem is the up-grades and the steps. All the information is available in the Personnel Department.

Supervisor Michel reported that Judiciary & Law Committee had taken a trip to Country Thunder with Sheriff Beth. The mobile command center is a very unique tool for the Sheriff's Department. Allowing only dispatchers to be present and it was communication for the deputies. Several members of different law enforcement agencies worked together. Also, he will be contacting state representatives regarding placement of sexual predators.

ORDINANCE 13

13. From Judiciary & Law Committee regarding Amending Chapter 9 of the Municipal Code of Kenosha County Entitled "Public Peace and Good Order"

The Kenosha County Board of Supervisors does hereby ordain that section 9.961.573 of the Municipal Code of Kenosha County be, and hereby is, created to read as follows:

"9.961.573 POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA

The provisions of Section 961.573(1) of the Wisconsin Statutes and any subsequent amendments are adopted except that the penalty upon conviction is a forfeiture of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500. This ordinance shall apply to first offenders only."
