

**MINUTES OF MEETING OF JUDICIARY & LAW ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE**

**July 15, 2008**

**Meeting Called to Order:** 7:00 p.m. by Chairman William Michel II

**Chairman Comments:** Supr. Michel expressed concerns that unmarked KSD cars do not have GPS. He would like this on the agenda next month for discussion. Chief Deputy explained that this is a decision for the Sheriff and he does not want them. The cars are not on the road enough. Michel said he is concerned about inmates being transported in Detective's cars without GPS and how the car could be located if the occupant was unable to radio. Chief Deputy responded that inmates are not transported in Detective's cars. He has not heard of complaints from detectives. Cost is also prohibitive and budgets are tight unless they would get some type of grant funding. Supr. Haas suggested that possibly they could wear a pager. Haas said that if the detectives are needed they are there and unmarked cars are there. Dispatch knows where they are. Haas would not suggest this if the Sheriff's Dept. does not want it. Michel said he would like to see anything that would make cars safer.

**Resolutions from the Kenosha Co. Sheriff's Department:**

1) Probationary Cabaret License – Hawg Heaven Bar

**Approved:** unanimously

Chief Deputy explained that this establishment is under new ownership. The only calls have been inspection/application related. All documents have been filed and fees have been paid. Michel asked if this is a new business. Chief Deputy replied that it is not new but was extensively remodeled.

2) FY08 Law Enforcement Justice Assistance Grant (JAG)

**Motion by:** Haas **Seconded by:** Johnson

**Approved:** unanimously

This resolution is to accept \$6,938.00 from the U.S. Dept. of Justice. This is 40% of the total grant that is split between the Sheriff's Dept. and Police Dept. 60% goes to the City because they have a bigger force. Funds will primarily be used to purchase digital cameras and some to purchase soft uniforms for special events. Michel asked if cameras would be used at accident scenes. Chief Deputy replied yes, they are trying to get away from 35mm.
