

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

All voters are encouraged to vote absentee ballot by mail

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to their municipal clerk. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing or online at [MyVote.wi.gov](https://myvote.wi.gov).

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the spring election or all remaining elections this year. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter or you may apply for an absentee ballot online at <https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/> Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail

**The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is:
5 pm on the fifth day before the election, April 2, 2020.**

Note: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

Voting an absentee ballot in person - limited hours and protective protocols

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified below for casting an absentee ballot in person.

All voters are encouraged to vote absentee ballot by mail. To receive a ballot by mail, requests can be made on myvote.wi.gov, or by email, elections@kenosha.org, or send request to City Clerk, 625 52nd Street, Kenosha, WI 53140. **Include a copy of acceptable photo ID.**

Limited appointments are available for voters who would like to vote on an absentee ballot in person. **Voters should keep in mind that there is no difference between voting absentee by mail and voting absentee in person.** The ballots and certificate envelopes are the same. All ballots, cast by mail or in person, are counted on election day. **Appointments are available Monday through Friday, March 23rd to April 3rd, every half hour from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. (7 a.m., 7:30 a.m., 8 a.m., 8:30 a.m.), two people per appointment.** To make an appointment, email elections@kenosha.org or call 262-653-4020.

If not registered, voters can make an appointment during the times listed above, or drop off their absentee ballot request and voter registration application accompanied by a copy of acceptable proof of residence in the white drop boxes outside of City Hall, 625-52nd St. (located on Eighth Avenue near the driveway of the parking lot and outside of the west entrance). Acceptable forms of proof of residence include a Wisconsin driver's license or ID, a utility bill, bank statement, or credit card statement.
