<p>NOTICE OF REFERENDUM CITY OF KENOSHA NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an election to be held in the City of Kenosha, on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, the following question will be submitted to a vote of the people:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Resolution 133-20 CITY OF KENOSHA KENOSHA COUNTY, WISCONSIN</p> <p style="text-align: center;">TO PLACE A HEALTH CARE ADVISORY REFERENDUM QUESTION ON THE NOVEMBER 3, 2020 KENOSHA CITY BALLOT TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE STATE OF WISCONSIN SHOULD SEEK EXPANSION OF THE MEDICAID-BASED PROGRAM IN WISCONSIN</p> <p>WHEREAS, to ensure all lower income Americans had access to health insurance, the federal Affordable Care Act expanded Medicaid eligibility to adults with incomes up to 138% of the federal poverty level, allowing people to qualify for coverage based on income, rather than a disability determination; and</p> <p>WHEREAS, expansion of Medicaid eligibility was at the option of the individual states; and</p> <p>WHEREAS, thirty eight (38) states, including the neighboring states of Michigan, Indiana, Iowa and Minnesota, have adopted the expanded Medicaid coverage; and</p> <p>WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has yet to take advantage of billions of federal Medicaid dollars associated with the expansion of Medicaid, which would have improved the state's Medicaid-based BadgerCare program, and which, as estimated by the State's Department of Health Services, would have provided access to BadgerCare to an additional 82,000 people, who need coverage; and</p> <p>WHEREAS, according to the Wisconsin Legislative Fiscal Bureau, the decision to reject federal Medicaid expansion funding under the Affordable Care Act has cost state taxpayers \$1.1 billion since 2014, including \$324.5 million in the current biennial budget alone; and</p> <p>WHEREAS, being underinsured and uninsured impacts local human services departments leads to untreated mental health or substance abuse issues and leads to reduction of preventative health care, which in turn can lead to losses of jobs, the inability to function and loss of self-sufficiency; and</p> <p>WHEREAS, the Wisconsin residents negatively impacted by the high numbers of unemployment due to COVID-19 would greatly benefit with this expansion; and</p> <p>WHEREAS, as the state of Wisconsin revenue is being negatively impacted by COVID-19 the expansion of Medicaid/BadgerCare would lessen the impact of monies assigned to health care on future state budgets.</p> <p>NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Kenosha City Council directs the Kenosha City Clerk to place the following advisory referendum question on the city-wide ballot at the election to be held on November 3, 2020:</p>	<p>“Should Wisconsin expand healthcare coverage under BadgerCare by accepting additional federal Medicare funds and providing healthcare coverage to an estimated 82,000 more Wisconsinites?”</p> <p>Passed: August 17, 2020 Drafted by: Daniel Prozanski Jr., Alderperson for the Fourteenth District And Edward R. Antaramian, City Attorney</p> <p>EXPLANATION OF REFERENDUM City of Kenosha, November 3, 2020</p> <p>“Should Wisconsin expand healthcare coverage under BadgerCare by accepting additional federal Medicare funds and providing healthcare coverage to an estimated 82,000 more Wisconsinites?”</p> <p>BadgerCare Plus is a health insurance program available to various segments of the population of Wisconsin, including low-income adults. Wisconsin Medicaid is the joint federal and state program that pays for the medical services for the low-income residents of Wisconsin. Currently, to be eligible for BadgerCare Plus, a person must meet certain non-financial and financial requirements, which generally includes for adults having income of no more than 100% the federal poverty level.</p> <p>To ensure lower income Americans have access to health insurance, the federal Affordable Care Act expanded Medicaid eligibility to adults with incomes up to 138% of the federal poverty level. Expansion of Medicaid eligibility is at the option of the individual states. While thirty eight (38) states, including the neighboring states of Michigan, Indiana, Iowa, and Minnesota, have adopted the expanded Medicaid coverage, the state of Wisconsin has not.</p> <p>It has been estimated by Wisconsin's Department of Health Services, expansion of Medicaid eligibility would have provided access to BadgerCare to an additional 82,000 people who need coverage.</p> <p>The effect of a “yes” vote will advise the City of Kenosha Common Council to recommend that the state legislature and Governor take necessary actions to accept additional federal Medicare funds and expand healthcare coverage in Wisconsin through BadgerCare Plus.</p> <p>The effect of a “no” vote will advise the City of Kenosha Common Council <u>not</u> to make any recommendation on the subjects to the state legislature and Governor.</p>
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<p>NOTICE OF REFERENDUM TOWN OF BRIGHTON NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at an election to be held in the Town of Brighton on November 3, 2020, the following proposed resolution of the Town Board will be submitted to a vote of the people:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Resolution No. 2020-8-10 THE TOWN OF BRIGHTON KENOSHA COUNTY, WISCONSIN</p> <p style="text-align: center;">RESOLUTION APPROVING ADVISORY REFERENDUM TO PROVIDE EXCLUSIVELY CURB-SIDE GARBAGE PICK-UP</p> <p>WHEREAS, Wisconsin law permits towns to seek advisory opinion of its residents regarding matters and issues important to said residents;</p> <p>WHEREAS, the Town of Brighton has had a long history and tradition of garbage drop off at or near the Town Hall;</p> <p>WHEREAS, the issue of curb side garbage pick-up has been discussed and raised on countless occasions by residents of the Town and its Board;</p> <p>WHEREAS, past attempts of surveys have been done to determine the Town resident's interest or absence of interest in curb side pick-up resulting in no clear guidance;</p> <p>WHEREAS, the improper use of the Town's past garbage drop-off by non-residents has increased over the past several years adding to Town expenses;</p> <p>WHEREAS, the continued use of Town property, driveways and parking lots for drop off garbage services has caused wear, tear and destruction to said Town property;</p>	<p>WHEREAS, the replacement costs to said driveways and parking lots will have to be paid for by the Town and ultimately its residents;</p> <p>NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the town of Brighton, Kenosha County, Wisconsin that the Town hereby adopts the following:</p> <p>1. The following referendum question shall appear on the ballot of the general election to be held on November 3, 2020:</p> <p>“Should the Town of Brighton cease to provide garbage drop-off services at the Town Hall and have Town wide curbside pick-up for all residents?”</p> <p>Adopted August 10, 2020</p> <p>The question should appear on the ballot as follows: “Should the Town of Brighton cease to provide garbage drop-off services at the Town Hall and have Town wide curbside pick-up for all residents?”</p> <p>EXPLANATION OF REFERENDUM A yes vote is merely advisory and will provide to the Town Board some indication of the Town residents' position on curb side pick-up; the elimination of non-residents using garbage drop-off; and the elimination of continued weekly wear, tear and damage to Town Hall property by traffic dropping off garbage.</p> <p>A no vote will likewise be advisory of the desire to keeping drop off service and requiring the Board to direct monies allocated for road repair or other services to repairs needed to the Town Hall road and parking lot.</p>
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
