For example, slowing reaction time, pain when looking over your shoulder, changes in your sight, hearing loss, and trouble with foot pedals, forgetfulness, or other health problems may have changed your driving skills. This is a classroom driver improvement course designed for motorists age 50 and over. \$24.95 for non-members for the online course. Some topics covered are: Vision and hearing changes, effects of medicines, reaction time changes, left turns and other right-of-way situations, new laws and how they affect you, and hazardous driving situations.
