Public Works/Facilities Committee Parks Division Status Report for March, 2022

- ***Kenosha County Veterans Memorial Park:*** Bids are due on 3/8/22 for the construction of the restroom pavilion, Army memorial shelter and two entrance signs. Construction will occur from early spring through fall, 2022.
- ***Old Settlers Park Band Shelter:*** Bids will be due on 3/31/22 for the construction of the band shelter at Old Settlers Park. This amenity was redesigned to create a more competitive bid process and rebid due to higher than expected bid results in 2021.
- ***Petrifying Springs Park Playground #4:*** Bids were due on 2/16/22 for the construction of the new #4 playground. Two bids were received and both bids were over budget. Next steps will determine how to repackage this project to be more aligned to the approved 2022 budget.
- ***Petrifying Springs Park & UW-Parkside Multiuse Trails:*** Bids were due on 2/17 for installation of the helical piles and purchase of four prefabricated pedestrian bridges. Both bids came within the project budget. The low bid for the four prefabricated bridges amounted to \$80,555. The low bid for the installation of the helical piles was \$27,385.60.
- ***Pringle Nature Center:*** See attached reports.
- ***Seasonal Recruitment:*** Seasonal positions are now open for lifeguards, beach manager, assistant beach manager, fee collectors, short-term maintenance, long-term maintenance, parks mechanic, and graphic designer/special event coordinator. Park staff has conducted in-person recruiting and interviews at local high-schools and universities.
- ***South Bike Trail:*** Three culverts have been replaced along the south bike trail (89th St. to Russel Rd). as part of the south bike trail comprehensive storm water management plan. Park staff is continuing with brush and tree removals along the South Bike Trail as weather allows.
