## Medicare Open Enrollment

October 15, 2022, through December 7, 2022

Medicare Open Enrollment is an important time for those with Medicare to review their current Part D prescription drug plan and Part C advantage plan, and determine if it is still the best option. Insurance companies can change plan premiums, deductibles, and co-pays each year. Switching to a different plan could result in extra money in your pocket.

- Check to see if your plan is still the best option for you. Your needs may have changed during the past year.
- You may find you're going to the doctor more or less often, the prescription drugs you take may be different, or you may need better access to health care services.
- Benefits can vary. Not all Medicare coverage options offer the same benefits. Plan benefits can change from year-to-year.
- When you visit [Medicare.gov/plan-compare](https://www.Medicare.gov/plan-compare), it will be easier than ever to compare coverage options and shop for plans. You may be able to find plans in your area that cost less, cover your prescriptions, allow you to choose your doctor or pharmacy, and offer extra benefits that Original Medicare doesn't cover, such as vision, and dental.
- Review your 2023 "Medicare & You" handbook. There is information about Medicare coverage, as well as Medicare Advantage, and Medicare Prescription Plans.

## How We May be Able to Assist You

In December 2021 a benefit specialist began working with a 73-year-old individual who informed her that he lost his dentures. His insurance denied a new pair because they had covered the cost of replacement dentures three years prior. He contacted the Kenosha County Aging & Disability Resource Center for help getting a new set of dentures and the benefits specialist offered assistance.

The benefit specialist reviewed the client's medical records and found he was diagnosed with both lower gastric issues and swallowing issues. He also was losing weight and the lack of dentures adversely affected his health. He had been relying on a liquid nutritional supplement which was very expensive.

The benefit specialist prepared a letter in support of a new set of dentures along with supporting documentation from the client's dentist and primary physician. The benefits specialist assisted the client in submitting the information for an appeal to his insurance. The client represented himself in the appeal. Thirty days later the client reported he won his appeal and received a new set of dentures.
