# Kenosha County Sheriff's Department

*TO ALL CONCERNED CITIZENS:*

On November 9, 1989, the Kenosha County Sheriff's department was summoned to County Highway "N" and the Des Plaines River Bridge in Paris Township, which is in the North Central Region of Kenosha County, near State Highway 45. Sheriff's Deputies found, at this location, the body of a new born baby boy. This baby boy was discarded under the bridge like so much garbage. This baby boy, once alive at birth, now lies cold and lifeless with no name or history, deprived of life by someone who would not or could not care for this child.

Our intention is to locate the mother of this child to complete our investigation and to insure that another child will not grow for nine months and be allowed to experience life for a brief moment and then spend eternity cold and nameless.

For these reasons, we in law enforcement are pleading for your help. We need your assistance in locating and identifying the mother of this new born baby boy, we refer to as "Baby John".

Baby John was a white male, seven pounds, 21 inches, long. He was a full term baby, alive at birth with no evident birth defects. If anyone knows of a neighbor, coworker, or anyone who was pregnant and due to deliver in late October or early November, and is no longer pregnant and no longer has the child, PLEASE call the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department Detective Bureau at 656-7304, extension 230. Callers need not give their name and all leads will be investigated. Rewards of up to \$1,000 may be granted through Crime Stoppers for information leading to the identification of the mother of "Baby John".

We are especially appealing to members and associates of the medical profession to assist us in this endeavor. Any information you may have as to a possible suspect in this case will be greatly appreciated and anonymity will be maintained. Again Baby John was a full term white baby boy weighing seven pounds at birth and was 21 inches long.
