COMMON NAME	DESCRIPTION AND CHARACTERISTICS
AMERICAN ELDERBERRY GROWTH RATE – FAST	A shrub with large flattened clusters of tiny cream-colored flowers in summer, fragrant; large clusters of small dark purple berries in late summer. Full sun to partial shade; moist, well-drained soils are best, but will tolerate some dryness as well as wet sites; tolerates alkaline soil. Can grow up to 12' tall and 10' wide.
BLACK CHOKEBERRY GROWTH RATE – MEDIUM	Black chokeberry is a deciduous, cold-hardy shrub, showing white flowers in the spring and colorful red foliage and heavy, dark fruit in the fall. Tolerates partial shade but thrives in full sun. It is also an excellent choice for those tough, low-lying wet areas, yet it can acclimate itself to dry locations as well. It reaches 4–8 feet in height. Black chokeberry provides browse for white-tailed deer and rabbits, and fruits for ruffed grouse.
BLACK WALNUT GROWTH RATE - MEDIUM	One of the scarcest and most coveted native hardwoods, Black Walnut is used especially for furniture, gunstocks, and veneer. Individual trees fetch attractive prices. Fragrant leaves. Likes deep, rich, well-drained soil; grows more slowly in drier soils. Grows to 50' to 75', 60' spread. (May self-pollinate, plant two trees to ensure pollination) The delicious nuts must be gathered early, before squirrels and other wildlife can consume them.
BALSAM FIR GROWTH RATE – SLOW	This pyramidal evergreen will grow in cool, moist and swampy areas. Dark flat needles ½-1" long, slow growing, symmetrical, evergreen tree. Soft, bright green needles. Nice fragrance for Christmas trees. Mature height 75', mature spread 20'.
BURR OAK GROWTH RATE - SLOW	The Burr Oak (<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i>) is a very long-lived though slow growing tree that grows to a height of 70-80 feet with a spread of about 80 feet at maturity. Prefers locations where it receives full sun and tolerates a variety of soil and moisture conditions. Yields large acorns with a distinctive fringed cap providing a food source for a variety of wildlife.
COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE GROWTH RATE – MEDIUM	One of the most popular ornamental conifers, the Colorado blue spruce (or simply, blue spruce) is a truly magnificent sight. Grows best in full sun, in moist, well-drained, fertile soils. The Colorado blue spruce grows to a height of 50–75' and a spread of 10–20' at maturity. Needles are stiff, short, and silvery blue to greenish blue in color. The species has an excellent natural shape and requires little shearing.
COMMON LILAC GROWTH RATE – MEDIUM	The Common Lilac is noted for its showy, fragrant bloom in the late spring. Flowers come in many colors ranging from white, pink, blue, lavender to reddish-purple, clusters of flowers sit against dark green, heart shaped leaves, and the fragrance is just delightful. Grows best in well drained, fertile soils, under full sunlight. Average height is 15'.
EASTERN ARBORVITAE GROWTH RATE – MEDIUM	Up to 20 feet tall and 6-8 feet wide at maturity. Very dark green color year-round. Medium growth rate and very hardy. Used for screening and foundation planting. When young it grows bushy but when it gets to 3-4 feet it grows more pyramidal. They prefer full sun to partial shade and can grow in a variety of soil conditions.
EASTERN RED BUD GROWTH RATE – MEDIUM	The Eastern Redbud (<i>Cercis canadensis</i>) does well in a variety of soils and prefers locations where it receives a minimum of four hours of direct, unfiltered sunlight each day. Growing at a medium rate, it reaches a height of 20-30 feet and a spread of 25-35 feet at maturity. Begins flowering at an early age (sometimes as early as 4-5 years old) and produces a profusion of rosy pink flowers in the spring. Leaves emerge a reddish color, turn dark green in summer, and then yellow in the fall.
FRASER FIR GROWTH RATE - MEDIUM	Often referred to as the Cadillac of Christmas trees. This tree has an excellent fragrance with exceptional needle retention. Strong branches are turned slightly upward which give the tree a compact appearance and shows the silvery color. Full to partial sun. Likes cool, moist, well-drained soils. Height 30-40 ft Width 20-25 ft.
HAZELNUT GROWTH RATE- FAST	A large fast growing shrub with showy spring flowers. The Hazelnut can grow to 8-12' tall with a crown spread of 10', creating a dense privacy screen, perfect for a hedgerow and as nesting sites for birds. The nuts of this American Hazel Nut have a higher nutritional value than acorns and beechnuts, making them a valuable food source for wildlife eaten by turkey, ruffed grouse, and pheasants.
HIGHBUSH CRANBERRY GROWTH RATE – MEDIUM	Highbush cranberry is also known as the American cranberry bush. Though not actually a cranberry, its fruit resembles cranberries with bright red color, fall maturity, and persists throughout winter. A generally low maintenance shrub once established, that will grow in moist to dry sites with plentiful sun. Native to North America. Flowers are white. Leaves are dark green in summer and reddish in the fall. Mature height of 6-12 feet and 8-10 feet wide.
NORWAY SPRUCE GROWTH RATE – FAST	The Norway Spruce is the most widespread, fastest growing, largest and most disease resistant spruce in the northern hemisphere. This is not a tree for a small yard! The Norway Spruce can grow 2-3+ feet per year their first 25 years under good conditions. The Norway spruce has a fibrous deep spreading root system, able to withstand winds up to 100MPH.
RED-OSIER DOGWOOD GROWTH RATE – FAST	Grows best in moist to wet soils with full sunlight. Average height is 8' and it spreads outward to 6'. Has bright red twigs with white flowers and white berries in the summer. Leaves turn dark red in the fall. The biggest selling point is the shrub's deep red stems that create a pop of color in the snowy, gray months. Fibrous root systems also provide effective erosion control on banks and slopes. Good for providing wildlife food and cover.
SUGAR MAPLE GROWTH RATE – MEDIUM	The Sugar Maple is a landscape standout. Medium to dark-green leaves turn yellow, burnt orange or red in fall. Tolerates shade, likes a well-drained, moderately moist, fertile soil. Do not plant in confined areas or where salt is a problem. Grows to 60' to 75' with a 40'-50' spread. The sugar maple tree is the principal source of maple sugar.
SWAMP WHITE OAK GROWTH RATE - MEDIUM	The Swamp White Oak (<i>Quercus bicolor</i>) is well adapted to low-lying areas with poor drainage but also does well in urban or suburban settings where it can tolerate compacted soil and drought. Prefers areas where it can get full sun. When mature reaches a height of 50-60 feet with a 50-60 foot spread. Produces acorns in pairs, each about 1 inch in length. Fall color in shades of yellow, bronze and reddish-purple.
WHITE PINE GROWTH RATE – FAST	The White Pine is a large, straight-stemmed tree with a pyramidal crown. Clustered soft blue-green needles. Ideal screen or windbreak. Likes moist, well-drained soils. Grows 50' to 80' with a 20-40' spread. Mature trees can easily be 200 to 250 years old.
WHITESPIRE BIRCH GROWTH RATE – FAST	Whitespire Birch has a nice narrow, pyramidal size and has chalky white bark that looks great all season long and because of its shape it's great along property lines. The bright green leaves rustle in the wind and turn the brightest yellow in the fall. It is heat tolerance and disease resistance. Grows well in full sun, reaching 50-60 feet when mature. It does well under a wide range of soil types.
WATER GEL ONE BAG WILL TREAT ABOUT 100 TREES	Water Gel is a powder, which is mixed with water to form a gel that the roots of the seedling are dipped into. The gel acts as a water-holding medium and helps to maintain an even moisture balance around the seedling roots after planting. The gel will remain active for at least one growing season.
